



The 2017 NSW 10 Rater State Championship

This is an ARYA Ranking Event

Hosted by the Northern Mariners at Mount Penang

4th and 5th November 2017

Eighteen skippers turned up to sail in the Championship including Andrew Reid from Melbourne, Greg Torpy from Queensland and a contingent of three from Canberra MYC including defending champion Stephen Sedgmen. The remainder of the competitors were from the host club, LMRYC and KBRYC.

The weather was cool with the promise of showers and a fluky two to five knot SSE breeze that swung around to the east and back again all day.

PRO Garry Bromley set a windward leeward course of two laps with a gate at the bottom and racing got underway in two fleets. The promise of showers came true at lunch time and it rained off and on for the rest of the day.

At the end of the day, after 10 races Andrew was in the lead sailing the very speedy Trance, Wayne Keavy was in second place sailing the Phoenix 5.1 and Scott Condie was third with the Aero 3. Close behind were Steve Sedgmen (Sanga) Owen Jarvis (Diamond) Phil Page (Diamond) Ben Taylor (Blade 3) Greg Torpy (Diamond) and Pat O'Donnell (Blade 5) all within 15 points of Scott.

Unfortunately, two skippers did not show on the very wet Sunday morning and Steve and Mark from CMYC decided they were better off to leave for the five hour drive back to Canberra. However, Jon Reid from LMRYC joined in to boost the fleet.

19 entries were reduced to 14 starters for Sunday, A & B fleet merged to one fleet in a 0-3 knot shifty southerly to easterly slop. The rain had set in for the 1st half of the day, but the show went on and we saw good hard racing. The large fleet made the starts interesting, consisting of a few, protests, recalls and a few more general recalls. Lack of wind and boat speed created a few minor incidents between skippers and a few old classic port and

starboards windward leeward had the voices on the shore raised (See video on the Northern Mariners Facebook page).

Andrew Reid dominated with the Trance mastering the available gusts to finish the Championship with a 21 point lead, followed by Wayne Keavy and his Phoenix 5.1 steered his boat consistently for 2nd place. The Battle for 3rd was close and Owen Jarvis's Diamond, managed to get the place over Scott Condie and his Aero 3 by 5 points and Ben Taylor only 10 points further back.

Light and shifty weather sailing is truly a skill, and was great to see the let's race attitude despite the weather! There were a few technical issues that affected a few boats in the fleet but that's part of racing.

Even though it was tough on the water and uncomfortable the Skippers showed great comradery by leaving racing on the water and mateship on the shore.
